# Faith Community Nurse (FCN)...Karen Kline

February is Heart health Month.....Recently my neighbor had been concerned about some weird heart symptoms he was periodically experiencing. He initially saw his cardiologist for this issue. His cardiac medications were changed several times, and he also had some diagnostic testing done, including wearing a Holter monitor. He continued to experience the same symptoms with no change. He came home from a recent visit and told me he was going to have a "thingy" implanted in his chest which could be there for three years monitoring his heart rhythms. Hum, I wasn't quite sure what exactly he was talking about, and he couldn't remember the exact name of the device.

So, of course I had to do some research on "thingy" implanted in the chest. Low and behold there is actually a device called ILR which stands for Implantable Loop Recorder. This device is implanted under the skin, in your chest wall overlying the heart. It continually records electrical activity of your heart similar to an EKG for up to three years. The ILR is constantly looping its memory and it has automatic triggers to store recordings. A patient can also activate and store recordings as well. Most of these recorders have a home monitor that can directly send information to your health care provider.

The purpose of the ILR is to find the causes of fainting, palpitations, very fast or slow heartbeats, and hidden rhythms that can cause strokes. It may also be used to monitor a patient's prognosis after an acute cardiac event.

The implantation of the devise is considered a minor outpatient procedure using local anesthesia. The device is about the size of a USB memory stick. It is activated by passing a magnet over the device. Most people have the procedure done without any problems, although sometimes there might be bleeding, bruising, mild pain at the insertion site or infection. Infection would probably require the devise to be removed.

The first ILP was implanted in 1990, with the first clinical experience published in 1995. Amazing. The first pacemaker was inserted in 1958 and the first defibrillator in 1980. These three devices have certainly changed the outcome of many people over the years they have been used. How blessed we are to live in an era where this type of testing is available!

#### THE WAYS OF THE KINGDOM...Jan Wise

Remember our anniversary celebration? Remember Pastor Kip's challenge to build a firm foundation in our personal lives and then in the life of our church as we step out into our third year? Remember the dinner afterward, so good, and then the testimonies of how God led various people to Grace Methodist, sounding almost like we didn't choose the church but the church chose us?

As we are praying for the changes we need to make for bringing things up to code and making space for developing ministries, this verse showed up (you know how that works!) in my daily devotions: "Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the Lord's purpose that prevails" (*Proverbs 19:21*). We have had many plans, some practical, some not so much, but as we discuss and imagine together, working to keep the unity of the Spirit among us, God's purpose will prevail and his mission for Grace Methodist will continue to unfold.

But there is a warning we need to heed. Mark puts it bluntly, as he writes: "If a house is divided against itself, that house cannot stand", (*Mark 3:25*). It's not what I see as most important but what God knows to be the best path for our church in 2025.

Back to remembering our anniversary celebration--remember the choir sang the song called, "A Call to Commitment"? The ending phrase kept going over and over in my mind: "This is the time and place, for us to change the world with grace." But I heard it this way: "This is the time and place for us to change the world with Grace Methodist!"

#### **Renovation Committee Notes**

The behind-the-scenes work of the Renovation Committee is well on the way. Behind-the-scenes work includes the following:

- our number one objective is prayer and ascertaining what the Lord's desires are for His church. We want every member to pray for this,
- we obtained a wish/want list from members and affected leaders of programs and have taken those to our professional design team,
- working with LEI (our professional design engineers)
- ➤ LEI obtaining permits and assuring compliance with county codes.

The next steps for the renovation project are to:

- schedule a meeting of the Renovation Committee with LEI to discuss expansion ideas and needs,
- LEI to begin constructing a design inclusive of required fire and building codes,
- LEI to prepare the approximate cost of expansion,
- Present full plans, expected cost to Trustees, Administrative Board, and Congregation, and
- Secure funding and a contractor.

This renovation of God's church will not be an easy or fast project, so please pray that God will continue to lead our efforts.
