A Message from Pastor Kip...A Burning Bush

Genesis 3:2 There the angel of the LORD appeared to him in flames of fire from within a bush. Moses saw that though the bush was on fire it did not burn up.

The above text is from Mose' experience with a burning bush. A few verses later God speaks to Moses from the bush. If you recall this is where God commissions Moses to save God's people. And the rest is history!



Other people have had like experiences in their lives, where they believe that God has "spoken" to them or revealed a divine truth to them. Such experiences can be referred to as burning bush moments.

On the morning of this past Maundy Thursday, I had a burning bush moment! I followed my usual routine: I went to the Hen House for breakfast and then off to the two downtown Inverness parks to walk. I enjoy listening to music while I walk, and sometimes I listen to country music and sometimes I listen to Christian music. This was a Christian music day. When I arrived at Wallace Brooks Park, I was seeking a place to sit for a few minutes before heading home. I was still listening to music as I walked, a cool down lap around the park.

I noticed that the lyrics of the songs were strangely touching my heart. It was like the songs were highlighting exactly how I was feeling on this particular morning. Each song made me hungry for what the song lyrics highlighted. Each song's lyrics made me hunger for a reminder of God's love. As I walked, I spotted a bench on the pathway, and decided that this would be a good spot. I had never sat here before because this particular bench is typically in the sun, and I am not a "sun person". But for some reason the sun seemed appealing on this day.

I sat there for a while, continuing to listen to the songs and praying. Then it was time to go. As I leaned forward to get off the bench, I looked down and saw my burning bush right there between my feet. Someone had written a message on the concrete with blue chalk. I could barely read it at first. I had to study it for a moment because the light blue color of the chalk blended into the sidewalk too much. When I finally made out what it said, I was stunned and nearly fell forward, off the bench. I just stared at it for the longest moment.

I started thinking back to my prayers as I listened to the music and the powerful lyrics. I started to think about what I had been seeking just moments earlier. The message was perfectly clear. This is what was written on the sidewalk: Jesus loves you.

Now most folks wouldn't think much of this simple truth. But when you are hungry for good news, this is huge. When I read the message, I did not put the emphasis on the word "loves". But rather on the word "You". God loves YOU! This made it personal. This said that Jesus loves me! He knows me. He knows my thoughts and concerns. He knows what I need. And at just the right moment, he took me to a bench where someone had innocently written to anyone who sat on the bench, that Jesus loves them.

So, let me remind you that God is still with us and is still offering burning bush moments. Yours may be right around the corner. Keep looking. Keep hoping. Keep the faith. He knows you. He longs to bless you. Because Jesus loves you!

Faith Community Nurse (FCN)...Karen Kline Dementia and Firearm Safety

Several weeks ago, David DeCarlo, Executive Director of the Office of Community Engagement and Transparency from the Citrus County Sheriff's Office came to our Memory Lane Support Group to discuss the issue of Dementia and Firearm Safety.

Dave provided group members with a copy of the book: "Dementia and Firearm Safety" by Dementia Education Inc. The book relates that those individuals who kept firearms in their home when their families were young, were probably very conscientious about practicing good firearm safety habits. In later years with the event of the "empty nest syndrome" many things may change in our lives: decreased dexterity and skills, eyesight and judgement and the possible onset of dementia. Families may unknowingly become relaxed with their safety measures. It is recommended that as we age, not only for our own safety, but for the safety of those around us, we should think of ways to strengthen our safety measures. A few of a quite long list are:

- Never leave a gun unattended, even if you are in the process of cleaning it.
- Always keep your gun(s) secured in your home in a safe place such as a safe, gun cabinet, or locked box designed for that purpose.

- Keep the safe/gun cabinet combination or key readily accessible to you, but secret from those not qualified to handle a firearm.
- Leave guns unloaded when not in use, and never leave a loaded gun unattended, even for a moment, to avoid accidental discharge or shooting.
- If you decide you no longer want to keep your firearms in your home, be sure to legally transfer ownership to a responsible party.

Since February 2018, Florida has what is known as a "Red Flag" law. This means that law enforcement agencies, with authorization from the court, can remove weapons from people when they become a danger to themselves or others.

Mr. DeCarlo provided a few extra copies of the book which you can borrow from our church library. It contains a lot of information about dementia in general and much more on maintaining firearm safety in the home.

Attend the National Day of Prayer Service at Grace Methodist, May 1
Pastor Bill and Pastor Kip hosted a breakfast for Homosassa church leaders. As they broke bread and shared experiences, they could see similarities and differences among their congregations. One has young families. Another has mostly retirees. One will host a food bank. Another will host meals and showers to people without a home. It will take more time to find ways to work together; however, the desire to build a stronger community for all Homosassa residents exists.

A basic tenet of church life is to pray. In everything, pray. As the first official group project, these pastors will join together in observance of the National Day of Prayer on Thursday, May 1. Beginning at 9 am, guests of all denominations and those who do not have church ties are invited to gather at Grace Methodist Church. The community prayer service will be held under the American flag on the front lawn.

The National Day of Prayer is an annual observance held on the first Thursday in May, inviting people to pray for the nation. While created in 1952 by the United States Congress, this is the first time that Homosassa churches have hosted a community-wide service. It will be highlighted with prayers, scriptures, and music. The theme chosen for this year is "Pour Out to the God of Hope and Be Filled". It is based on the Gospel message of Romans 15:13. The event will hopefully become a Homosassa tradition that can rotate to other churches in the years ahead. Guests can bring lawn chairs and bottles of water for comfort. If the weather is inclement, the service will move inside.

THE WAYS OF THE KINGDOM...Jan Wise

SCRIPTURE: As He (Jesus) approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it, and said, "If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace--but now it is hidden from your eyes. The days will come upon you when your enemies will build an embankment against you and will encircle you and hem you in on every side. They will dash you to the ground, you and the children within your walls. They will not leave one stone on another, because you did not recognize the time of God's coming to you. (Luke 19:44)

THE STORY: Pastor Bill included this part of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, a part we often miss because of our focus on the waving palms, Jesus riding on an unbroken colt and the exultant cries of the crowd. In the minds of the cheering people, Israel now had her king who would take his throne in Jerusalem. Then Israel would once again regain the greatness it had known in the days of King David.

But Jesus knew the people didn't understand he had come to be their Savior, that they needed a savior. A few had believed, but even those closest to him kept asking when he was going to restore Israel to its former greatness. Jesus knew what the Israelite people would have to go through in future years because they did not recognize him as "God coming to them". So, as the people around him rejoiced and sang, Jesus wept and spoke prophetic words about pain-filled days ahead. They could not see, would not accept, his predictions because their minds were filled with once again becoming a powerful nation, serving God under their new king.

TO PONDER: So today we are seeking the restoration of our nation as a law-abiding republic, needing both purpose and direction as to how we can bring that about. 2nd Chronicles 7:14 gives us a promise of God that is as alive and active today as it was back in King Solomon's day: "IF MY PEOPLE, who are called by MY NAME, will HUMBLE THEMSELVES and PRAY and seek my FACE, I will forgive their sin and heal their land.

Let's ponder this and then make a decision, remembering that the biggest word in the whole promise is the word, "IF".
