

A Message from Pastor Kip

Greetings Church Family! Easter is closing in quickly now! By the time you receive this newsletter, Easter will only be a few weeks away. Will you be ready?

The disciples weren't. The arrest, beating and crucifixion of their Master, Rabbi, and Lord tore their hearts apart. They could not begin to imagine how things had gotten so out of control. One day they are all together, healing the ill and mending the injured. The next thing they know is that from the day they entered Jerusalem for the Passover Celebration, life changed drastically.

We cannot begin to imagine their horror and confusion. They were told by Jesus that this would happen, but it probably sounded too crazy to really believe. They all had varying perspectives of what they hoped for through Jesus. The cross was not one of them.

Yet, the cross did indeed release a new and startling presence of hope. In 1 Corinthians 15:19, Paul reminds us of the proper perspective of our hope in Jesus when he writes, If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.

Why would he write that? Because the hope we hold in this life in relationship to the life of Jesus, is the foundation of the eternal hope that will blossom forward. If we think that Jesus is our hope only for the troubles of this world, then we are cutting ourselves grossly

short. We are also cutting Jesus' life, death, and resurrection short as well. Paul closes this thought by reminding us that as all humanity died through Adam's sin, so all humanity is open to eternal life through the resurrection of Jesus.

Three days after the awful death of Jesus, the disciples were awakened to the shocking news that their Lord had indeed risen from the dead. Somehow, someway, what was dead was now alive! I sense that for the disciples, the sudden and shocking truth of Easter made a much greater impact on them than we could ever imagine. This impact changed their lives forever. It should change ours as well. Our absence from the original Easter should not dampen our spirits toward the truth of this event. Because He lives, so too do we who love him!

I hope that you are looking forward to a very blessed Easter Celebration! It will be another great day in the life of our church and in our lives as well!

"Hugs are an important part of our physical and mental health!" The reason they feel so good has to do with our sense of touch. Hugs increase our well-being and pleasure. Social touch bonds us to one another and helps maintain our relationships. Hugging releases endorphins which make us see hugs and touch as rewarding. The simple means of touch is the glue that binds us

together. Even the simple act of stroking and petting our pets has benefits to our wellbeing as well as to that of our pets.

Hugs cause a decrease in the release of cortisol, a stress hormone, and hugs help to reduce blood pressure and heart rate in stressful situations. Giving and receiving hugs has also been shown to be a strength factor in our immune systems. Being hugged conveys a sense of safety, love, and knowledge that we are not alone.

While it is important to continue to keep ourselves safe, it is just as important that we don't give up our hugs forever. If you find yourself craving socialization, do it safely. Continue to wash your hands, mask up if it makes you feel safer, and start connecting with friends and family.

THE WAYS OF THE KINGDOM...Jan Wise

The Ark of God...(adapted from a Dr. Jeremiah's devotional)



The Philistines captured the Ark of God from the Israelites and kept it for months. This resulted in trouble for their camp, so they put the Ark on a cart pulled by oxen and sent it back to the Israelites. When the Ark arrived at its Israelite destination, the Levites unloaded it. Then some curious men looked inside the Ark, and God struck them dead for their sin.

This unexpected judgment from God made the people afraid. So, men from another Israelite town came to get

the Ark and took it to the house of Abinadab. It remained there for years, bringing blessings with its presence. Many things transpired while the Ark remained at Abinadab's house. The Israelites wanted a king like its neighbors. So, after being warned by the prophet Samuel of the cost of living under a king, the Lord told Samuel to anoint the

people's choice, a man named Saul. Saul's failure to follow God's commands led Samuel to reject him as king and anoint David. Many battles occurred as Saul sought to kill David while also leading his people in wars against Israel's enemies. When Saul and his sons died in battle, David then became King of Israel.

As king, David recognized the significance of the Ark to the Jewish people. He gathered thirty thousand men of Israel and set out for the house of Abinadab to bring the Ark to Jerusalem and place it in the tent prepared for it. They set the Ark of God on a new cart, with Uzzah and Ahio guiding the cart's path. The whole house of Israel celebrated before the Lord "with all their might" as the procession proceeded. Then the oxen stumbled, and Uzzah reached out his hand to steady the Ark. Because of his irreverent act, God struck Uzzah dead there beside the Ark.

David was angry because of God's wrath against Uzzah. In his anger, David feared God and wondered how he would ever get the Ark to Jerusalem. So, David took the Ark of the Lord to the house of Obed-Edom the Gittite for three months, and God blessed that household abundantly. Hearing of the blessings the Ark brought to Obed-Edom's house; David determined to get the Ark to Jerusalem. However, this time he used the method of moving the Ark that had been instructed by Moses--the God-honoring, traditional method David would have known. The Levite priests carried the Ark on poles resting on their shoulders, stopping regularly to offer burnt offerings to God, and praising him. Though it took much longer, the Ark arrived safely in Jerusalem, to be set in the place David had provided.

How often have we used a process not honorable before God in order to speed up our result? Does "the end justify the means"? We learn from King David that God cares as much about how we do things (the process) as he does about the end result.

Renovation Committee Notes...Ron Snowberger

The renovation committee and Pastors met with the architect/engineer Local Engineering, Inc. (LEI) on March 5 to review the expansion ideas for GRACE Methodist Church. LEI will complete the final drawings for review within two weeks from that date. We will also receive a realistic cost expectation/estimation for the expansion. Once reviewed and finalized, the plans will be submitted to the Administrative Board for approval. At this point, the plans and cost expectations will be provided to the congregation through a formal presentation. After approval from the Administrative Board, a contractor will be selected through a competitive bid process.



VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO CLEAN CHURCH...Karen Kline

There's an old saying that goes like this... "Cleanliness is next to godliness." This means that maintaining a clean and tidy environment is considered almost as important as being morally good.

Of all the tasks that must be accomplished to maintain a smooth-running operation, be it home, office, or place of worship, housekeeping is probably the least attractive to volunteers. However, I believe everyone enjoys being in a clean, well-maintained facility.

YOUR church needs volunteers to step up to the task of maintaining our inside facilities like we do maintaining our outside facilities. For the outside, we have three teams of at least two members, maintaining the grounds. They work on a rotating basis, so each team works one or two days a week for a calendar month, then they are off for two months.

If we could get enough volunteers, perhaps eight to twelve, we could divide the workload so each team of two or three only has to work one month and have three months off. Team members, would decide among themselves how the overall work would be accomplished. Step up and **volunteer**, even if only two weeks at a time which would be great.

- Easter Sunday Celebrates the resurrection of Jesus.
