



A Message from Pastor Kip...Lost Bible

There seems to be a pattern developing in my life. And so far, it seems to be a good one. It's not the one where I walk to the shed for a tool, and then when I get there, I have no idea why I am out there at all. And it's not the one where I have something in my hand, must put it down for some reason, and then, within moments, I cannot find it. These are not good patterns! But they do seem to be everyday patterns.



This is a pattern where something is mysteriously missing and then suddenly just pops up out of thin air! Like the lost checkbook and cash. I hope you remember that one. This involves something even more critical; God's Word!

In 1989 our family moved to Forsyth, Ga. We were appointed to a "Student Pastorate" from Candler School of Theology, and I served Ebenezer U.M.C. in Forsyth. I led worship and preached every Sunday and drove into Atlanta every Tuesday through Friday for seminary.

This was a very special church in our lives. Besides being my first appointment, we made lifelong friends there also. In later years I would have the blessing of officiating the weddings of three daughters of one family! This was indeed a special place.

Upon the bittersweet time to say goodbye and move back to Florida to take my first FL Conference appointment in Apalachicola, I was presented two very special gifts. The first was a U.M.C. hymnal signed by a Discipleship Studies class of young people which met in the evening. I have used that hymnal every Sunday since. The second gift was a Bible presented by the church during our last service there. This too became a treasured gift. While I did not use this particular Bible every Sunday, it remained nearby and very meaningful to me.

Then the years began to fly by. After four moves to different churches, I managed to lose track of this Bible. Then, just like the checkbook - poof! - it reappeared! It first reappeared as a picture in a text. The cover had wear marks on it, and my name on the bottom in gold! It had to be mine! Then came the second picture. This picture was of the dedication

page. There it was: "Presented to Kip Younger, May 17th, 1992 from Ebenezer U.M.C., Forsyth, GA." Holy Cow! Isn't that just something?

The craziest thing about the long-lost Bible is that it almost made its way to Africa! Yes, that far away place on the other side of the world! It seems as though while serving at Inverness U.M.C., our Children's Director somehow ended up with this Bible in her office. When she resigned and packed her office somehow this Bible got packed up with her other materials. Then, it must have made its way into her home in Pine Ridge, and remained there for some time. Then when she moved to Ohio, so did the Bible.

She is currently preparing for another move to Michigan to be near family. It seems as though this Bible had been placed in a book cabinet when she first moved into her home in Ohio. Now, years later, she started to pack the materials in the cabinet, and found the Bible. She sent me the above-mentioned pictures and then packed the Bible into another box to be taken to her church and then shipped to Africa for young people to have.

When I texted her back to ask her to please send it to me, she realized the Bible was soon to leave for Africa with many other books and study materials, all repacked into new and bigger boxes. She called the church and told them; "Please! Don't do anything with the books I just brought down!" Too late. She had to go through the repacked boxes to locate the Bible. She found it in the first box! Greatly relieved, she brought the Bible home.

I think this ended up being a "Double God Thing"! I will soon receive the Bible given to me out of love from my first church appointment, fourteen years later. And she not only found the missing Bible, but she found it the second time quickly and easily! Ain't God something?

Exciting News...We have a new addition to the Health Ministry for Grace! As a Faith Community Nurse, I have been contracted with the BayCare Health System for quite some time. In the past few years, BayCare added another level to their program called Community Health Promoter (CHP). Recently, I talked with Katie Snowberger about joining me in this capacity as part of our Health Ministry program. Katie jumped at the opportunity and recently completed her training with BayCare based on the "Church Health Center Congregational Health Promoter Training and Model for Healthy Living". Like myself, she will have a signed contract between BayCare and Grace Methodist Church.

Luke 9:2, "Then he sent them to preach the kingdom of God and to heal the sick". This scripture seems to be a basis for a Congregational Health Ministry. It is not simply a role of preventing disease/illness but embracing the call to live whole and healing lives.

So then, what exactly is a CHP? It's a person who is a respected member of the congregation, who serves within their congregation and community at large, and is interested in promoting health. It is focused on seven dimensions of health that include

faith, movement, work, emotional nutrition, family and friends, and medical to "fulfill a sense of self and well-being", and more.

Katie has already started her ministry with the start of the Helping Hand Ministry for our congregation. She and I have already started putting our heads together with wonderful ideas for all of you.

So please congratulate and pray for Katie and the growth of the Health Ministry for our church.

Message from Pastor Bill – What to Expect for the Next Three Sundays "Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love." (1 John 4:7–8, NIV)

Can you remember what it was like when you first realized that you were in love with someone. Perhaps there were many long phone calls or letters back and forth, or a lot of time together. You longed to be together. I've heard people say they felt that way about their church. They love being there and being together with the people—always anticipating more time together. That is the way it should be with God/Jesus/Holy Spirit. Always wanting more of the God.

An <u>underlying theme for the next three weeks of preaching is **more of God**</u>. June 1 will bring us closer to God as we hear Jesus praying to His Father about us. How he longs for us to be in him as he is in the Father. That in our diversity with each other, we will be united because we are all in love with the God who loves us.

The second Sunday of June we will experience the gift of the Holy Spirit. This is Pentecost Sunday. We think of this as the birthday of the Church. God's Spirit touched the hearts, minds, tongues, ears and more that day. We too are blessed with the presence of the Holy Spirit. Just look around and see what God is doing in the hearts and minds of the people. See how they love one another. See what they are doing to make the church a warm and friendly place.

The third Sunday of June is Trinity Sunday and Fathers' Day. This winter we listened to Del Tackett lead us through The Truth Project. He did a marvelous job of sharing The Nature of God and explaining the Trinity and why it is important to each of us. Therefore, I am planning to share some of his presentation. It not only presents the Trinity, it demonstrates the family relationship as a pattern of the Trinity.

Friends, I am excited about the next three weeks of getting closer to God through Jesus praying for us in *John 17*, the presence of the Holy Spirit, and the visualization of the Trinity through the teaching of The Truth Project.

THE WAYS OF THE KINGDOM...Jan Wise

SCRIPTURE: A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another. (John 13:34-35)

THE STORY: Pastor Kip talked about this scripture a couple weeks ago, and it caught my attention. So later that day I reread it and found myself wondering why it was a "new

command". Every church "goer" knows we are to love God and one another. So why was this new?

Then I remembered the words in 2 Corinthians 5:17: "Therefore if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come. The old has gone, the new is here." These men were as "in Christ" as it was possible to be before the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Jesus was speaking to them of a new relationship among them only fully possible when the Holy Spirit came to live in them, enabling them to love each other as Christ had loved them. But the most amazing part to me is Christ's last sentence: "By this everyone will know you are my disciples if you love one another." Not by the many things we do, not by how big our congregation, not how large our offerings, but by the way we love one another will we be recognized by everyone to be disciples of Jesus.

This verse also explained to me Jesus' words written to the church at Ephesus in Revelation 2:4-5. Jesus recognized their positive Christian accomplishments, their hard work and their perseverance. Then he wrote, "Yet I hold this against you: You have forsaken the love you had at first! Consider how far you have fallen! Repent and do the things you did at first. If you do not repent and do the things you did at first, I will come to you and remove your lampstand (your church) from its place."

Perhaps in their busyness to accomplish things for God, the Ephesians had gradually moved from the loving of one another to a passion for their projects. Satan was able to deceive them into believing that what their church did for God caused people to see what good Christians they were. People would come to their church and join in their projects. But Jesus knew finding a place full of God's loving acceptance would be the first need of the seeking heart. The world offers many worthwhile projects, but churches in which God's love flows among those who "go there" and reaches out to enfold those who visit are rare. Yet it is by this loving atmosphere Jesus said people would know we are his disciples!

<u>TO PONDER</u>: What kind of a church are we? What kind of church do we want to become? From these verses we have considered, what is the most important attribute to guard and encourage among us? As God continues to prosper us and help us develop in our love for him and each other, what do you see as important things we can do, individually and as a group, to find and follow his plan for us as his Church?


